Community Forum for Zika Virus to be Held in Starr County

Rio Grande City, Texas (December 2, 2016) — A local forum to discuss efforts to combat the Zika Virus threat in Starr County has been scheduled for December 6, 10:00 am, at the South Texas College Starr Campus Auditorium, (142 FM 3167, Rio Grande City.) Members of the Starr County community are invited to attend this free event.

Although the World Health Organization (WHO) says Zika is no longer a global emergency, they say the virus remains a threat. This week, Texas confirmed the first local Zika transmission in the Rio Grande Valley. In light of this, health officials in Starr County have taken the initiative to organize a forum to provide updated information on Zika virus and the measures being taken by local government and health officials to prevent its spread in the county.
